



CALL FOR PAPERS

The Scientific Committee of the International Conference of Nanoscience and Nanobiotechnology – ICONNANO 2025 hereby announces to all interested parties the rules for abstract submission and presentation of scientific papers, in accordance with the terms established in this call.

I – GENERAL GUIDELINES AND DEADLINES:

1. Paper submissions must be made exclusively through the following link:
<https://www.iconnano.com.br/>
2. The organizers are not responsible for user internet failures during submission, incorrect form completion, or late submissions.
3. Types of works accepted:
 - a) Experimental studies (original research);
 - b) Case reports or literature reviews (narrative or systematic reviews);
 - c) Meta-analyses, experience reports, or research projects (proposals for studies to be conducted).
4. Presentation formats: e-poster or in-person oral presentation.
5. Maximum number of authors per paper: 10 (including the presenter and advisor). Co-authors may also participate in other papers.
6. Submission of the abstract, presentation of the work, and publication in the conference proceedings are conditional upon the presenter's registration and compliance with the abstract formatting rules.
7. After the abstract has been accepted, updates to author names or affiliations may not be permitted.





8. Submission period: from November 7, 2025 to December 2, 2025.
9. Notification of accepted abstracts: by December 2, 2025. An automatic email will be sent via Posterize to the corresponding author. Please ensure that the email address provided during submission is correct.
10. Revision period for abstracts (for works with a "Revision requested" decision only): 24 consecutive hours.
11. Thematic areas:
 - a) Biological Sciences;
 - b) Biotechnology and Nanotechnology;
 - c) Entrepreneurship and Innovation;
 - d) Computing and Applied Information Technology;
 - e) Bioeconomy and Sustainability.
12. Specific instructions will be sent by email to the presenters of accepted papers closer to the event date. Therefore, please ensure that your email address is correctly entered during registration.

II – ABSTRACT PREPARATION GUIDELINES:

1. Abstracts must be written in ENGLISH (mandatory).
2. Abstracts must follow the template available on the event's Posterize platform: <https://posterize.org/evento/iv-international-conference-of-nanoscience-and-nanobiotechnology/>
3. The maximum number of authors per paper is 10 (including presenter and advisor). Co-authors may appear in up to 15 other papers.



4. Abstract structure:

- a) Title: must clearly identify the nature of the work. It should be specific, concise, and relevant, and indicate whether the study reports data from in vitro, human, or animal trials, or if it is a review. Maximum: 300 characters (with spaces).
- b) Introduction: present the general topic or key concepts for understanding the research and state the main objective of the study. Maximum: 600 characters (with spaces)
- c) Author list: full first and last names of all authors must be provided. Middle name initials may be added. At least one author must be designated as the corresponding author. After acceptance, updates to names or affiliations will not be allowed.
- d) Methodology: describe the materials and procedures used in the research, as deemed necessary by the author. Maximum: 600 characters (with spaces).
- e) Results: highlight the main findings and their significance. Maximum: 1000 characters (with spaces).
- f) Conclusion: present the closing remarks, aligned with the objectives and results of the research. Maximum: 300 characters (with spaces).
- g) Keywords: descriptors that identify the main idea of the study. Keywords should be specific to the work but reasonably common within the field. Maximum: 150 characters (with spaces).



h) References: standardized list of the sources that support the paper, allowing verification, attribution, and reuse. Maximum: 1500 characters (with spaces).

5. Authors of approved abstracts will later be required to submit the full paper for presentation.

III – SUBMISSION AND REVIEW PROCESS:

1. The submission process takes place on the Posterize platform, accessible through the event website: <https://www.iconnano.com.br/>
2. The presenter must have a confirmed registration in ICONNANO WarmUp (categories: undergraduate student, postgraduate, or professional) and will be responsible for submitting the abstract. The presenter does not need to be the first author. If another presenter is designated during submission, they must also have a confirmed registration.
3. Maximum number of authors per paper: 10 (including presenter and advisor).
4. Maximum number of submissions per registered participant: 2.
5. Maximum number of works per co-author: 15. This means that co-authors may also appear in up to 15 other papers.
6. At the time of submission, the preferred presentation format must be indicated:
 - a) Oral communication: in-person presentation on the lecture stage.





- b) Poster: in-person electronic poster (e-poster).
 - c) Video: online synchronous oral presentation.
7. If the number of in-person oral presentations exceeds the venue capacity, some papers may be reassigned to online synchronous or e-poster formats.
 8. If the number of in-person oral presentations exceeds the venue capacity, some papers may be reassigned to online synchronous or e-poster formats.
 9. Submitted abstracts will be evaluated by the Scientific Committee and invited reviewers.
 10. Evaluation criteria include: originality or novelty of the research; scientific relevance or social impact; clarity of information; adherence to ethical principles (when applicable); coherence among objectives, methodology, results, and conclusions; and compliance with this call's formatting rules.
 11. Review outcomes:
 - a) Accepted
 - b) Revision requested
 - c) Not accepted
 12. Revision stage: reviewers may issue suggestions, request corrections when necessary, or clarify questions about the work. Authors whose abstracts receive a "Revision requested" decision will have up to 7 consecutive days to submit a revised version. After review, the evaluator may issue a final decision: "Accepted" or "Not accepted."





IV- PRESENTATION GUIDELINES:

1. Presentations may be delivered in Portuguese, Spanish, or English.
2. In-person oral presentations will take place on December 5, 2025 (Friday), from 09:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
3. Presentation duration: 5 minutes + 3 minutes for discussion.
4. Presentations will be evaluated by members of the Scientific Committee and invited researchers. The presenter is responsible for being at the assigned location and time..
5. The e-poster will be automatically generated by the Posterize platform.
6. Characteristics of oral presentation slides (in-person or remote): There is no official slide template for this event; authors have full creative freedom. However, the following guidelines must be followed:
 - a) Dimensions: 16:9 (Widescreen landscape format in PowerPoint);
 - b) Required elements: title, authors, affiliation, introduction, methodology, results, conclusion;
 - c) Optional elements: acknowledgments, funding, references;
 - d) Recommendation: minimize text on slides and prefer images and/or tables whenever appropriate.
